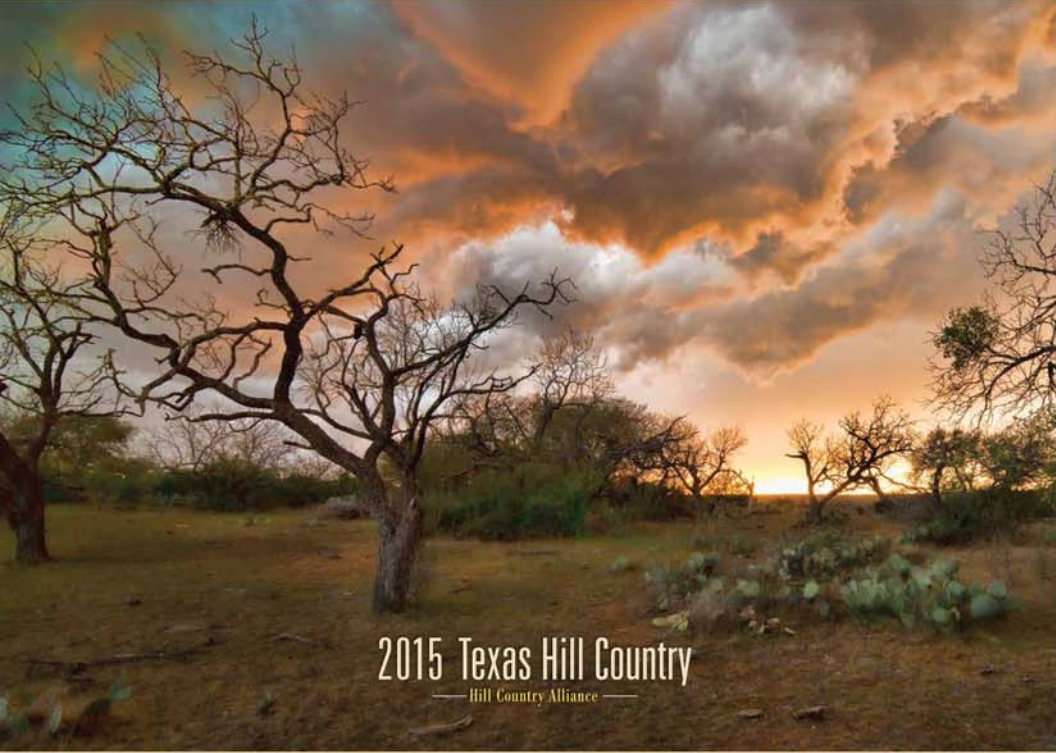

Drought: Texas' drought of record occurred over a multi-year period in the 1950s and is the benchmark by which the state's current drought disasters are measured. We are currently in a drought of severe magnitude and as we approach a new drought of record in this decade, our population will be about four times that of the mid-1950s. Tree ring and isotopic studies show that Texas has suffered far worse droughts prior to the advent of our climate records. If we are to maintain the health of our economy and our ecology, we must do a better job of conserving the water that we have.

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Fact: Texas' rainfall totals vary from east to west and average from more than 60 inches per year in East Texas to less than 10 inches per year in West Texas. The Hill Country region receives between 10 and 32 inches per year.
