LBJ Ranch Hangar, Lyndon B. Johnson National Historical Park.

11 miles west on Hwy 290 from Johnson City, turn right at Ranch Road 1 and drive 3 miles, turning right on Park Road 49. Follow the event signs to the LBJ Ranch Hangar.

Or, 9 miles east on Hwy 290 from Fredericksburg, turn left at Ranch Road 1 and drive 5 miles, turning left on park Road 49. Follow the event signs to the LBJ Ranch Hangar.
