Town Hall Meeting for TCEQ Sunset Review

Lamont Jefferson, member of the Sunset Review Commission of the Texas Legislature, and State Representatives Trey Martinez Fischer and David McQuade Leibowitz will preside. The meeting will be moderated by Jensie Madden of the Comal County League of Women Voters. We will follow a *citizens to be heard* format, allowing six minutes each for presentation from government agencies and citizens groups. Individuals will be accorded three minutes each. Sunset Commissioners, State Representatives and Senators in attendance will have the opportunity to ask questions and converse with each presenter as they see fit. We are aware of the breadth of topics that will be covered in this meeting, and are prepared to keep things moving so that all concerns can be heard. Since this topic is so vital to the quality of life for the citizens of Central Texas, we hope that you will be available to join in this important conversation.
