#### 13 Million pounds of toxics discharged into Texas rivers and streams

Industrial facilities dumped 13 million pounds of toxic chemicals into Texas' waterways in 2007, according to a report released today by Environment Texas: Wasting Our Waterways: Industrial Toxic Pollution and the Unfulfilled Promise of the Clean Water Act. The report also finds that toxic chemicals were discharged in 1,900 waterways across all 50 states.
