

Join noted outdoor photographers and authors Brian and Shirley Loflin at Fossil Rim Wildlife Center for an exciting and educational wildlife photography workshop.

Both one-day and two-day workshops are offered in 2012.

One Day Workshops: April 14 and September 23.

Two Day Workshops: May 19-20 and September 15-16.

These workshops include a classroom session and hands-on instruction covering different aspects of wildlife photography and up close and personal photography of endangered species within the Center's 1,800 acre facility.



The one-day workshops feature a private photo tour conducted along nine miles of remote roadways through the best wildlife habitat. Photography is timed to make the best use of the quality light and behavior of 52 species of animals on Fossil Rim's pastures. The drive is conducted in spacious, open vehicles designed to maximize the experience for wildlife photography. A stop for lunch at the Overlook Cafe, and evaluation of the day's photos by the instructors completes the experience.

The two-day workshop adds a second day of photography, three meals and lodging at the Center's Safari Camp, an excellent facility in the heart of the wildlife habitat.

Some of the animals photographed include white rhinoceros, blackbuck, European red deer, waterbuck, gemsbok, zebra, addax, giraffe, sable, aoudad and greater kudu just to name a few.

Workshop participants are encouraged to bring their SLR camera, a wide angle lens and zoom lens that reaches out to 200 or 300 mm. Longer lenses are not needed.
